HISTORY OF THE RCA DOME

From the NFL's Indianapolis Colts, to the NCAA Final Four and the World Basketball Championship for Men; from the annual Fire Department Instructors Conference to the nation's largest exhibition for African-Americans, Indiana Black Expo; from a Billy Graham church service to concerts, Circle City Classic, and World Gymnastics, the RCA Dome is an ideal site for a variety of events.

Unlike most domed stadiums, the RCA Dome opened in 1984 as part of a much-needed expansion to the convention center, not as a stand-alone sports venue. Opening as the Hoosier Dome at a cost of \$77.5 million, the facility immediately became home to the Indianapolis Colts and other national and international events. Currently with football seating capacity at 57,965, the RCA Dome hosts over one million guests annually. In addition to hosting NFL action, the facility is booked year-round with numerous events. Past prestigious events have included the Closing Ceremonies for the 1987 Pan American Games, the 1987 World Indoor Track & Field Championships, the 1991 World Gymnastics Championships, the 2002 FIBA World Basketball Championship, the 2004 U.S. Olympic Team Trials in Wrestling, the 2005 NCAA Women's Final Four and the NCAA Men's Final Four held in 1991, 1997, 2000, and 2006. Indianapolis looks forward to hosting the NCAA Men's and Women's Final Four many times in the future.

Located in the heart of downtown Indianapolis within walking distance of numerous hotels and restaurants, the stadium complex in conjunction with the convention center now houses more than 400,000 square feet of exhibit space and nearly 140,000 square feet of meeting space. The RCA Dome floor alone offers 95,000 square feet of versatile space.

The Indiana Convention Center & RCA Dome is managed by the Capital Improvement Board of Managers (CIB). The CIB was created in 1965 by the Indiana General Assembly and is empowered to finance and manage capital improvements.

GUEST INFORMATION

ALCOHOL POLICY – Indiana State Law prohibits the sale of alcohol to any person under the age of 21. Guests will be required to show proper identification and proof of age when purchasing alcoholic beverages. Starting times and/or days of events may dictate alcohol restriction policies. Some events may prohibit the sale of alcohol in the RCA Dome. Guests may not bring alcohol from outside sources into the stadium or take any alcohol with them upon exiting the ticket-taking checkpoint. Guests will not be allowed to enter into the RCA Dome if visibly intoxicated. Intoxicated and/or disorderly behavior may result in ejection from the RCA Dome without refund.

AUTOMATED TELLER MACHINES (ATM) – There are 10 ATMs inside the RCA Dome. These are located at each gate on the lower and upper levels and adjacent to Aisles 113 and 313.

BANNERS – Banners are permitted inside the RCA Dome provided that they are in good taste and do not obstruct the view of any fans or stadium signage. The RCA Dome reserves the right to confiscate or remove any and all banners.

CAMERAS & VIDEO EQUIPMENT – Use of cameras and video equipment inside the RCA Dome will be determined by the event promoter. Please note that such use may be prohibited during certain events. Video cameras are prohibited for all Indianapolis Colts home games.

CLUB LOUNGES – The Budweiser Club (north) and the Bud Light Club (south) are open to guests with club seat tickets for all Indianapolis Colts home games. Please keep your ticket with you at all times for ease of access in and out of the club lounges. The club lounges may or may not be open during other events.

CONCESSIONS – The RCA Dome and Centerplate offer a wide variety of food & beverage choices with more than 30 permanent stands, 50 portable, and over 266 points of sale during major events. Concessions open to all guests at the same time gates open.

- All concession stands are accessible to people with disabilities. Should you require additional assistance, please contact a Centerplate employee or the nearest security person.
- Concession items and locations are subject to change based on Centerplate's objective to enhance the guest's experience.
- Centerplate is the sole licensed food, beverage and retail operator authorized to operate in the RCA Dome. Food & beverage from outside sources are not permitted in the RCA Dome.
- Any unlicensed vendor that is operating on RCA Dome property is doing so without a license and is subject to be cited and removed from the property.

DESIGNATED DRIVER PROGRAM – The RCA Dome encourages responsible fun. Each designated driver (age 21 or over) can sign up for the Good Sport Program at Colts home games to take friends and family home safely. They will receive a coupon for a free O'Doul's redeemable at any portable bar location. The designated driver will also be entered in a



drawing for a weekly prize. Winners will be notified by phone. Sign up at the Good Sport Locations at Aisle 106 and 343 or at the Indianapolis Colts Guest Relations booths at Aisle 107, 132, 308 and 333.

ELEVATORS – An elevator for people with disabilities is located on Street Level at Capitol Avenue immediately south of the RCA Dome Ticket Office. Additional elevators are available on the south side of the RCA Dome at the Senate Avenue entrance.

EVACUATION PROCEDURES – If there is any type of emergency situation that might cause a delay of the event or an evacuation of the stadium, please listen for directions on the public address system or from security personnel. People with disabilities should contact the nearest usher for assistance.

FIRST AID – The First Aid office is located on Street Level at the entrance for people with disabilities on Capitol Avenue. First Aid personnel are on duty during every event. Please find the nearest usher or security person if you need assistance.

GATES & ENTRY POINTS – There are several gates/entry points surrounding the RCA Dome. Please see map below. All gates and entry points will open for all Indianapolis Colts home games two hours prior to kick-off. Event promoters will determine gate opening time and may designate specific gates for entry for non-Colts events. The gates to be used for entrance into the RCA Dome will be printed on the event ticket.

GATES OPEN – Gates open two hours prior to kick-off for all Indianapolis Colts home games. Event promoters will determine gate opening time and may designate specific gates for entry for non-Colts events.

GUEST CONDUCT POLICY AND RULES – Indianapolis Colts fans are the best in the NFL because of their enthusiasm, team support, and Hoosier hospitality. The players, coaches, staff and fans shape the Colts image. We encourage our fans to create a high-energy environment supporting the home team while maintaining a family-oriented atmosphere.

The Indianapolis Colts have established Rules of Conduct that will allow everyone in attendance at the RCA Dome to enjoy all aspects of a National Football League game. Any violations of these rules could result in immediate expulsion from the stadium. These rules include, but are not limited to:

- Entering the playing field or interfering with the progress of the game.
- Refusing to show ticket stub when asked by a stadium representative.
- Attempting to sit in seats for which you are not properly ticketed.
- Using foul or abusive language or gestures.
- Threatening other patrons with words and/or actions.
- Fighting.
- Throwing or kicking any object in the RCA Dome or onto the field.
- Interfering with other guests' ability to enjoy the game.
- Wearing clothing with abusive or vulgar terminology or inappropriate photographs or symbols.
- Wearing obscene or indecent clothing.

- Standing on seats or chairs.
- Stepping over chairs from one aisle to another.
- Standing, sitting or loitering in aisles, ramps or other areas of conveyance.
- Placing food or beverages on walls, ledges or overhangs that may spill or drop on guests below.
- Running or jogging in the RCA Dome.
- Disorderly conduct.
- Public intoxication.
- Having an open container of alcohol (other than that dispensed by concessionaire).
- Possession or use of drugs.
- Public indecency.
- Obstructing justice.
- Criminal trespass.
- Selling items or tickets on RCA Dome property.
- Distributing or displaying handbills without prior consent.
- Smoking or spitting tobacco juice.

Those observing other guests violating these policies should report the incident to the nearest stadium representative.

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS GUEST RELATIONS – For your convenience, the Indianapolis Colts Guest Relations booths are manned at Aisle 107, 132, 308 and 333 during Indianapolis Colts home games. Guest Relations staff is available to assist with a variety of inquiries including ticket problems, accessibility, lost children, and other general questions.

ITEMS NOT PERMITTED IN THE RCA DOME – The following items are NOT permitted inside the RCA Dome: food & beverage items from outside sources, bottles, cans, liquor containers, weapons, coolers, bags, large purses, backpacks, horns, artificial noisemakers, and other missile-like objects. Please be advised that nothing larger than a small personal handbag, subject to inspection, will be permitted inside the RCA Dome.

LOST & FOUND – Lost & Found items may be turned into any usher or security personnel during events. These items will be taken to the Advance Ticket Sales/Guest Services Office adjacent to Aisle 113 during an event. After each event, items will be left at Central Security for the Indiana Convention Center & RCA Dome. For further information, please call 317-262-3350.

LOST PARENTS, FOUND CHILDREN – Children who have lost their parents should be escorted to the nearest usher or security person.

PARKING – Over 22,400 parking spaces are located within four city blocks of the RCA Dome and over 66,000 spaces in the downtown area. Several garages and lots located around the stadium provide quick and easy access to nearby highway ramps. Parking for persons with disabilities is provided in each of the lots and is available on a first-come first-served basis.

MERCHANDISE & NOVELTIES – The RCA Dome offers several merchandise and novelty stands throughout the stadium that are used for all events selling merchandise. Guests may also want to visit the Indianapolis Colts Pro Shop located in Circle Centre Mall.

PEDDLING/VENDING/LEAFLETING – Free speech activities may not impede safe pedestrian flow or block access to the stadium. Individuals or groups may be asked to move if it is felt it is a safety hazard. Vending, peddling, or product sampling is not allowed on stadium property unless approved by the event promoter.

RESTROOMS – The RCA Dome has restroom facilities for both men and women on every level of the stadium. All restrooms are accessible and include baby-changing stations.

SECURITY – All guests will be subject to inspection upon entering the RCA Dome. The following items are NOT permitted inside the RCA Dome: food & beverage items from outside sources, bottles, cans, liquor containers, weapons, coolers, bags, large purses, backpacks, horns, artificial noisemakers, and other missile-like objects. Please be advised that nothing larger than a small personal handbag, subject to inspection, will be permitted inside the RCA Dome. Guests may refuse inspection, but then may be denied entrance into the RCA Dome.

Please contact the nearest usher or security person for immediate assistance. Ushers are located at every aisle during major events. You may also contact security by dialing ext. 3350 from the nearest red house phone.



SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES –

- Assisted Listening Devices – Assisted listening devices are available at the RCA Dome First Aid office located at the entrance for people with disabilities on Capitol Avenue.
- Club Seating – Access to club seating is available to people with disabilities with club seat tickets via wheelchair lifts.
- Concessions – Mobile concession stands service seating areas for people with disabilities on Suite Level and also at Aisle 410 and 417.
- Drop Off Point – People with disabilities may be dropped off and picked up at Street Level on Capitol Avenue immediately south of the RCA Dome Ticket Office. Those with event tickets may enter the RCA Dome here and access the elevator at this entrance. People with disabilities may also enter via the south side accessible entrance on Senate Avenue.
- Elevators – One elevator is located at Street Level on Capitol Avenue at the entrance for people with disabilities. Four elevators are located just inside the Senate Avenue entrance on the south side of the stadium. All elevators are operational when gates open to the public until approximately one hour post event.
- Parking – Parking for people with disabilities is provided in each of the surrounding lots and garages and is available on a first-come first-served basis.
- Seating – Wheelchair accessible seating is available for all events. Availability in certain areas may vary due the configuration of each event.
- Wheelchair Availability – A limited number of wheelchairs are available for use during RCA Dome events on a first-come first-served basis. They can be obtained at the RCA Dome First Aid Office located at the entrance for people with disabilities on Capitol Avenue. Guests will be asked to leave a driver's license as a deposit for the wheelchair.

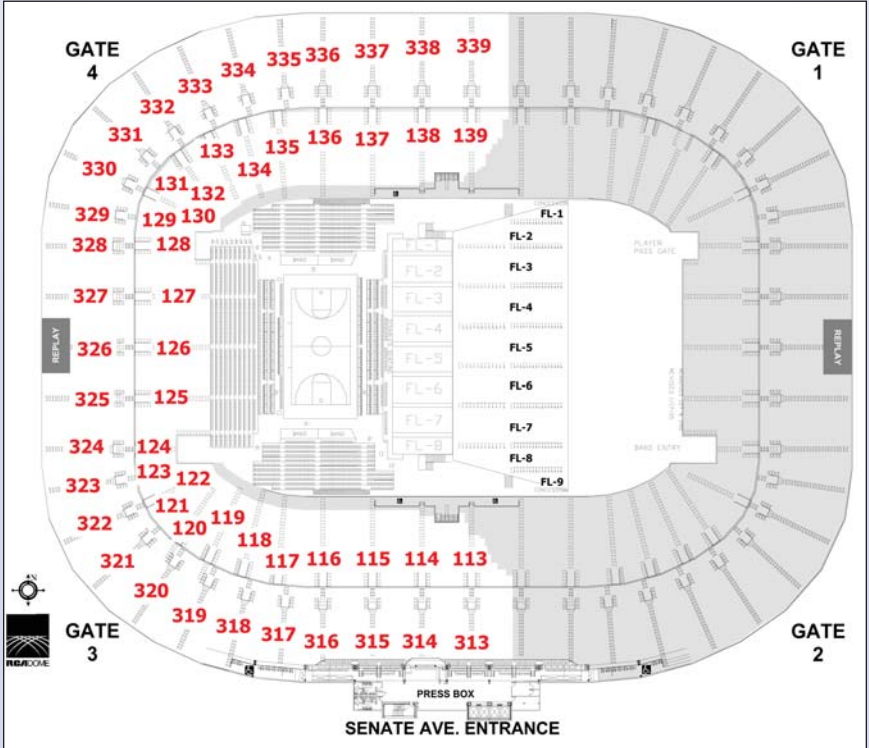
SMOKING POLICY – The RCA Dome is a smoke-free facility per City County General Ordinance No. 44 Sec. 616-201 effective March 1, 2006. Smoking is prohibited in any enclosed public place including the Indiana Convention Center & RCA Dome. Smoking is permitted outside any revolving door on the Lower Level. A pass-out may be required for some events.

SUITES – There are 104 corporate suites in the RCA Dome. Each suite is fully furnished and includes a wet bar, color televisions, and access to the finest catering. Suites may be available for rental on a single event basis. For further information on leasing suites, please contact the Indianapolis Colts at 317-297-2658.

TICKET OFFICE – The RCA Dome Ticket Office is open Monday-Friday 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Hours are extended on event days. All tickets to RCA Dome events may be purchased in-person at the RCA Dome Ticket Office, by calling Ticketmaster at 317-239-5151, or on-line at www.ticketmaster.com. Please contact the RCA Dome Ticket Office at 317-262-3389 for information regarding lost or stolen tickets or to confirm hours of operation on event days.

THE AIRPORT

Take the Airport Expressway to I-70 east to West Street (Exit 79A). Turn left and go north.

CHICAGO, IL

Take I-65 south to West Street/Martin Luther King Jr. Drive (Exit 114) and go south.

CINCINNATI, OH

Take I-74 west to I-465 west to I-65 north to I-70 west to West Street (Exit 79A). Turn right and go north.

COLUMBUS, OH

Take I-70 west to I-65 north to West Street/Martin Luther King Jr. Drive (Exit 114). Turn left and go south.

DANVILLE, IL

Take I-74 east to I-465 south to I-70 east to West Street (Exit 79A). Turn left and go north.

FORT WAYNE, IN

Take I-69 south to I-465 south to I-70 west to I-65 north to West Street/Martin Luther King Jr. Drive (Exit 114). Turn left and go south.

LOUISVILLE, KY

Take I-65 north to I-70 west to West Street (Exit 79A). Turn right and go north.

SOUTH BEND, IN

Take US 31 south to I-465 west to I-65 south to I-65 south to West Street/Martin Luther King Jr. Drive (Exit 114) and go south.

TERRE HAUTE, IN

Take I-70 east to West Street (Exit 79A). Turn left and go north.

LUCAS OIL STADIUM

...A Profile

Now under construction in downtown Indianapolis is the new Lucas Oil Stadium, a \$675 million multi-purpose facility that will replace the current RCA Dome. Directing the project is the Indiana Stadium and Convention Building Authority.

The new venue is a seven-level stadium with a retractable roof that will seat 63,000 for football and up to 70,000 for basketball, conventions, concerts and other major public assemblies. It is scheduled to be completed by August 2008.

The stadium will be home to the NFL's Indianapolis Colts, host NCAA Men's and Women's Final Four basketball games and be used for major conventions, trade shows and events such as the Indiana Black Expo and Circle City Classic.

Lucas Oil Stadium will cover 1.8 million square feet and include 140 corporate suites.

HKS of Dallas, Texas, is the lead architectural firm in the project, assisted by Indianapolis firms A2S04 and Browning Day Mullins Dierdorf. The construction manager is Hunt Construction Group of Indianapolis, assisted by Smoot Construction and Mezzetta Construction of Indianapolis.

The stadium is being financed with funds raised jointly by the State of Indiana and the City of Indianapolis, plus a \$100 million contribution by the Colts. The stadium has enabled the Colts to sign a long-term commitment to remain in the Hoosier capital.
